Captain Kangaroo passed away on January 23, 2004 at age 76,

which is odd, because he always looked to be 76 (DOB: 6/27/27). His death reminded me of the following story.

Some people have been a bit offended that the actor, Lee Marvin, is buried in a grave alongside 3 and 4-star generals at Arlington National Cemetery. His marker gives his name, rank PVT and service USMC. Nothing else. Here's a guy who was only a famous movie star who served his time, why the heck does he rate burial with these guys?

Well, following is the amazing answer:



I always liked Lee Marvin, but didn't know the extent of his Marine Corps experiences. In a time when many Hollywood stars served their country in the armed forces often in rear echelon posts where they were carefully protected, only to be trotted out to perform for the cameras in war bond promotions, Lee Marvin was a genuine hero. He won the Navy Cross at Iwo Jima. There is only one higher Naval award ... the Medal of Honor!



If that is a surprising comment on the true character of the man, he credits his sergeant with an even greater show of bravery.

Dialog from "The Tonight Show with Johnny Carson": His guest was Lee Marvin...




Johnny said, "Lee, I'll bet a lot of people are unaware that you were a Marine in the initial landing at Iwo Jima .. and that during the course of that action you earned the Navy Cross and were severely wounded."

"Yeah, yeah... I got shot square in the bottom and they gave me the Cross for securing a hot spot about halfway up Suribachi. Bad thing about getting shot up on a mountain is guys getting shot hauling you down. But, Johnny, at Iwo, I served under the bravest man I ever knew... We both got the Cross the same day, but what he did for his Cross made mine look cheap in comparison. That dumb guy actually stood up on Red beach and directed

his troops to move forward and get the hell off the beach.. Bullets flying by, with mortar rounds landing everywhere and he stood there as the main target of gunfire so that he could get his men to safety. He did this on more than one occasion because his men's safety was more important than his own life.

That Sergeant and I have been lifelong friends. When they brought me off Suribachi we passed the Sergeant and he lit a smoke and passed it to me, lying on my belly on the litter and said, "Where'd they get you Lee?" "Well Bob.... if you make it home before me, tell Mom to sell the outhouse!"

Johnny, I'm not lying, Sergeant Keeshan was the bravest man I ever knew. The Sergeant's name is Bob Keeshan. You and the world know him as Captain Kangaroo."



On another note, there was this wimpy little man on PBS, gentle and quiet.

Mr. Rogers is another of those you would least suspect of being anything but what he now portrays to our youth.

But Mr. Rogers was a U.S. Navy Seal, combat-proven in Vietnam

with over twenty-five confirmed kills to his name. He wore a longsleeved sweater on TV to cover the many tattoos on his forearm and biceps.

He was a master in small arms and hand-to-hand combat, able to disarm or kill in a heartbeat.



After the war Mr. Rogers became an ordained Presbyterian minister and therefore, a pacifist. Vowing to never harm another human, he also dedicated the rest of his life to trying to help lead children on the right path in life. He hid away the tattoos and his past life and won our hearts with his quiet wit and charm.

America's real heroes don't flaunt what they did. They quietly go about their day-to-day lives, doing what they do best. They earned our respect and the freedoms that we all enjoy. Look around and see if you can find one of those heroes in your midst. Often, they are the ones you'd least suspect, but would most like to have on your side if anything ever happened.

Spotlight On One Of Our Own!

The Man of Honor Society recognizes John Steve Krukowski as our Spotlight recipient for April - May 2017.

John was born on 1 MAR 41. He was raised in the Town of Guenther till the age of sixteen. His family then moved to the City of Wausau. John graduated from Wausau Senior High and although he did not attend college, John began his "degree in life" when he enlisted in the Army on 30 JAN 62. John's MOS of Supply Specialist at Fort Leonard Wood, MO was short lived. A transfer to Germany showed a knack for vehicle maintenance, triggering a job change to 63C, General Vehicle Mechanic. He served in that capacity for 4 years.

Sgt Krukowski was transferred back to the States for 6 months and then shipped to Cam Ranh Bay, Vietnam where he served for 13 months. He mainly taught personnel in Truck Driving and went on Command Maintenance and Material Inspections of other units. When his tour of duty was over, he returned to the States and ETS'd on 29 JAN 69, serving a total of 7 years.

John joined the Wisconsin National Guard, Wausau, WI in August 1978 as a 63S, Heavy Wheel Vehicle Mechanic and also as a 63N, M60A1/A3 Tank Systems Mechanic. He retired in August 1993, at the rank of Sergeant First Class. While he was in the Guard, his civilian job was at Precision Body and Frame, Wausau WI for 20 plus years, retiring in March 2001.

SGT Krukowski's medals and awards include two Overseas Service Bars, Good Conduct Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, Vietnam Campaign Medal, National Defense Service Medal, NCO Professional Development Ribbon (3rd award) and the Expert Rifle Badge.

John and his wife Gert have four children - Mary, Patti, John Jr and Linda. They have given them eight Grandchildren.

In his spare time, John likes to fish, hunt, golf and use his green thumb gardening.

SFC (R) John Krukowski joined the Man of Honor Society in March 2012. We are very fortunate to have this dedicated individual in our group. John is reliable, generous with his time and can always be



counted on to assist with any projects or events of the MOH.

John has served his family, country and state with great honor. The Man of Honor society thanks you for your dedicated and loyal service.
