The Man of Honor Society recognizes Larry Allen Grosinske as our Spotlight recipient for June - July 2017.

Larry was born on May 15 1953 in Wausau, Wisconsin. He was raised in the Town of Wausau along with his older brother John and younger brothers Ronald and David. Larry graduated from Wausau East High in June 1971. He was then employed with Crestline Windows of Wausau which he worked for five years. An opportunity at Wausau Papers of Brokaw followed, in which he worked for 35 years, retiring in February 2012.

Larry joined the Wisconsin National Guard, Wausau, WI in August 1971 as an 11E, Armor Crewman. On 5 November 1971 he reported to Basic Training at Fort Knox, Kentucky. While there, he also completed his Advanced Individual Training of Armor Crewman. He graduated in March 1972. He returned to Home Station, Wausau WI. He transferred to the Transportation Section, becoming a Motor Transportation Operator. He advanced in the section, gaining the position of Transportation Section Sergeant and attaining the rank of Sergeant First Class.

Tours of State Active Duty were in Gresham, WI in 1973 - Indian take-over of Alexian Brothers' Novitiate and Irma, WI in 1976 – Employee Strike of Lincoln Hills School. Tour of Federal Active Duty was to Germany in January 1986 – Return of Forces to Germany (REFORGER).

Larry's military service awards include Army Service Ribbon, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Army Reserve

Component Achievement Medal-3rd award, NCO Professional Development-3rd award and Army Reserve Component Overseas Training Ribbon. SFC Larry Grosinske retired his military career in January 1992.

Larry married his lovely wife, Lenore on October 21, 1978. They have two daughters, Becky (Christopher) Hopper and Aimee (Shawn) Hollendieck. They have been blessed with five grandchildren Ava, William, Lucas, Mack, Caleb.

Larry's favorite pastime is riding his Harley Davidson with the Seekers Motorcycle Club. For 15 years he served as President to the Seekers and currently serves as the Vice President. Larry also enjoys woodworking and deer hunting.


