




Marsha A. Kruzan, 63, Wausau, died Friday, March 23, 2012.

## American Veterans **Traveling Tribute**



As you all know we have quite a big project going on for Manof-Honor. The committee

started meeting and working on this in October of last year. We have accomplished a lot but there is still more work to be done. The last couple of meetings we have been working on the agenda for all four days and it is for the most part complete. however our schedule of events is not carved in stone just vet. We will start Wednesday, June 20th, by meeting the truck carrving The Wall at Cedar Creek and it will then be escorted into town with motorcycles, fire cles. This should take place at about 3 p.m. We will then have a short ceremony at the VFW to welcome them to Wausau.

On Thursday morning we will need volunteers starting at 7 a.m. to assemble The Wall and set everything up so we are ready to open to the public at around noon on that day. We will need to staff this event from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. every day except for Sunday. Sunday the Wall will continue its journey to its next location by mid afternoon. Also we will have security there 24 hours a day. We will have different events going on every day including but not limited to flag raising, the singing the National Anthem and many other things. We are in the final stages of arranging a flyover by the US Air Force.
