

# Wausau Trio Returns Stolen USMC Sword to Rightful Owner

Retired Marine Colonel Kenneth Russom shipped his marine corps sword to Quantico Virginia in 1965 for his first assignment after graduating from Officer Candidate School. The sword never made it and he was forced to buy a new one. Life goes on.

A Wausau woman, Dee Hanz, had gotten a marine sword from an Uncle who had passed away about 15 years ago. After going through her possessions to sell or give away unwanted items she came across the sword. She contacted a friend and he said it should go back to the owner who has his name engraved on the



sword. She turned to Paul Missett, a Marine Corps Veteran and member of the Man of Honor Society (MOH) and he knew he somehow had to get the sword back to the owner. He turned to Jim Campbell a retired Lt Col from the Marine Corps, co-founder of the Never Forgotten Honor Flight and also a member of the MOH Society, for assistance. Jim Campbell to the rescue. He traced down the owner of the sword



and it was returned to him. Ken Russom was in awe when he saw his sword after 53 years.

Marines helping Marines is what both Campbell and Missett are all about. As Man of Honor members they also contribute greatly to assist Veterans and their families in need, which is the MOH goal.
