
After the ceremony all were invited to stay for a lite luncheon ??? Baked Chicken, wiped potatoes,

He joined the Marine Corps in 1994 and went to San Diego for Boot Camp. After boot camp he was sent to Camp Pendleton where his duties were as a 2531, a Field Artillery Operator. In 1996 he was transferred to Japan (Okinawa). While there he was assigned duty on the USS Belwood and had the distinct opportunity to deploy to Russia for a few days where he had the opportunity to go ashore and visit with a few of the locals. He then was transferred to Camp Pendleton and was discharged in 1998 as a Corporal.

His decorations include the National Defense Service Medal, Good Conduct Medal, Sea Service Deployment Ribbon and a Meritorious Unit Commendation.

Jamie became a member of the MOH in March 2016. Since then he has been extremely active in all of

our activities. He participates in our parades and he works behind our bar during the annual raffle. He is always lending a hand when we are setting up for the raffle and is one of the last to leave afterward.
