TO SIMPLIFY THE VETERAN'S QUALIFI-CATION FOR THE NEVER FORGOTTEN HONOR FLIGHT, & FOLLOW SUIT WITH OTHER WISCONSIN HONOR FLIGHT HUBS; THE FOLLOWING CHANGE IS EF-FECTIVE 12/14/2022:

If you served Honorably on ACTIVE DUTY, in the RESERVES, NATIONAL GUARD OR IN-ACTIVE CLASS 3 RESERVES (IRR) anywhere at any time, in any branch during any of the following conflicts: WWII, Korean War, or Vietnam between Dec. 7, 1941, and May 7, 1975, you are eligible.
