Spotlight On One Of Our Own!

Our spotlight for this period recognizes Clarence (Duke) Treu. Duke was born and raised in Wausau, Wisconsin and graduated from Wausau High School in 1959. On 9 May 1963 at a Chapel at Vandenberg AFB, California, he married his charming wife, Gail. Duke and Gail have 2 daughters, Linda and Laura. Duke was employed at the Brokaw Paper Mill and retired from there after 33 years. After his retirement he drove a school bus for 10 years, a job he very much enjoyed.

Duke enlisted in the USAF in June 1959 and was discharged in June 1963 as an AlC (E-4). After basic training at Lackland AFB, Texas he went to Amarillo AFB, Texas where he trained and became a Fuel Supply Specialist. He would then be assigned to Eielson AFB, Alaska, refueling many types of aircraft and then transferred to Vandenberg AFB, California, where in 1962 he was selected to be part of the Honor Guard for President John F. Kennedy during his visit to the base. His military decorations include the Air Force Good Conduct Medal, the National Defense Service Medal and the Presidential Unit Citation.

Duke has been in the Man of Honor Society for the past 5 years. He has been very active in the organization, attending all our meetings, helping to set up and tear down the tents used for our raffles and spent a great deal of helping with the Vietnam Traveling Wall when the MOH brought it to Wausau. Duke is a quiet gentleman, always showing respect for others. He is a pleasure to work with and is very sincere in all of our efforts to assist veterans in need.


We are very fortunate to have Clarence (Duke) Treu as a member of the MOH. He has brought great


