*Passes admit the pass owner and accompanying passengers in a private vehicle. For areas that charge a per person fee, the pass admits the pass holder and 3 additional adults (16 and older). The Senior and Access Passes may provide a 50 percent discount on some amenity fees charged for facilities and services such as camping, swimming, boat launch, and specialized interpretive services. The passes generally do NOT cover or reduce special recreation permit fees or fees charged by concessioners.

Spotlight on one of our own


In the October-November issue of our newsletter, we are proud to recognize Teresa Holewinski. She is a newer member but is making her presence felt, with her hard work and dedication.

Teresa was born in Freeport, Illinois, and graduated from High School there in 1983. Shortly after graduating, she joined the Naval Reserve in 1984, did her boot camp training in Orlando, and did her A school in San Diego as a data processor. She was then assigned to Fleet Intelligence Center Europe and Atlantic, in Norfolk Va. She separated in 1989, But 9/11 brought her back to the Navy. Teresa reenlisted in 2002 and did six overseas deployments starting with Landstuhl Army Hospital, Germany for two years assisting with the large number of wounded coming from the Iraq and Afghan battlefields. Next, she deployed to the USNS Mercy, a Navy Hospital ship providing care to remote areas of Cambodia, Indonesia, and Vietnam. After that, she was deployed to Guantanamo Bay Cuba, for logistical support, for 154 prisoners. While she was there, the prisoners went on a hunger strike and had to be force-fed which was beyond tiresome and resulted in more cell raids and even tighter security of the detainees. Can you say, how lucky can one person get? The jungles of southeast Asia and then GTMO with striking detainees? In 2013 Teresa was deployed to Bahrain serving as a logistical Petty Officer First Class, at Sheik ISA Air Base, in southern Bahrain, providing support for defense and air operations. Teresa spent 2017 and 2018 in Kabul, Afghanistan, assigned to NATO Resolute Support as the only Navy enlisted. Her duties were as an aide to a Marine Brigadier General, administrative inside the wire, and his personal security outside the wire. She did one more tour in Bahrain and retired in December 2020. We decided that her decorations were so vast, there wasn't room for them all. But Teresa told me that what she is the most proud of is her Joint Service Commendation medal - combat.

Teresa worked for East Bay/Footlocker corporate, for twenty years between deployments here in Wausau. She states that of the twenty years in East Bay, nine of them, she was on military duty and that her job was always

there upon her return. I know it's the law, but many Companies have found ways to circumvent that system. Hats off to East Bay /Footlocker.

Teresa has three children and three grandchildren. Tyler, her son lives here with a five-week-old girl, and Haley who also lives in the area. The oldest daughter, Shawna, lives in Dallas with her two sons. Not to worry, they are all ardent Packer fans.
