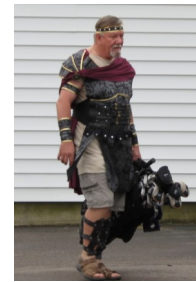

Harry Alvey is currently under hospice care at Forest Park Village in Wausau. Harry recently advised Lisa Hessel a social worker that "I would like to become a member of the MOH Society, because of all the good work they do." Harry is a retired Torpedo man's Mate Chief Petty Officer who spent 21 years in the United States Navy. Harry turned 91 years old on August 16th. On August 13th MOH Members Bernie and Gerri Knippel, Rick Sisterman, Ric Carr and Jeff Morgan traveled to Forest Park Village to make this happen. Bernie briefed Harry as to why we were there and then introduced everyone in the MOH and President Jeff Morgan presented him with a white Navy MOH cap, his MOH coin and his MOH Certificate showing his membership into the Society. Harry's daughter Carol Rewey and granddaughter Marnie Schroeder were present for the ceremony as were some of his close personal friends. There was a huge smile

on his face and he said "Thank You" to all of us for granting his wish. I joked with Harry and told him he was now the 2nd oldest person in the Man of Honor Society (Joe McGrath is 94). He got a big kick out of that. It was a great day for Harry and his family and I can assure you they were all very proud. It was a very emotional ceremony for many of us. It was a wonderful day and an absolute honor and pleasure to make this happen to a very proud retired United States Navy Chief Petty Officer.

The Journey of a Lost Purple Heart



Around 20 years ago my wife and I bought a cottage in the Harshaw area that needed some remodeling. I wanted to make the living room larger but I needed to move a wall that was

part of a storage room so work began with demolition of shelves and the wall. In part of the wall I found a small box and inside to my surprise I had found someone's Purple Heart Medal! Being I had spent time in the military myself, I realized how significant this medal is and I decided then to make it my mission to find the rightful owner.

Since then I had been asking every person I would meet that has had anything to do with our cottage and people that lived in the Harshaw area but had no luck. I went online to see if there was a military site to help, I also talked to Bernie Knippel but he did not know how to go about it so another dead end. Then last fall I told this story to Jim Busko, who had also lived in the cottage for a short time, and he also became very interested in the idea of finding the owner of the Purple Heart. Then on May 7th he called excited with the news. He had been able to make contact with two more people that did know who the owner was and that they lived in Kenosha. However, there was still no telephone number to call to find the family.

This was now turning into Jim's mission as well and he called

every Miller in the phone book until he found the family of Curt Miller, who turned out to be the owner of the Purple Heart. Curt had a Army tour in Vietnam as a helicopter mechanic and side gunner, also a tour in the Navy after that. I called and talked to his brother, Mark, and learned that Curt had passed away in 1998. The family had looked for the medal to place it with him but they could not find it. Now that they realized it had been found, they were very excited to get it back.

Now for the good part! On Monday, June 15th, my wife Connie, and I drove down to Kenosha, WI to meet with the family of Curt Miller. We were set to meet them at 5 p.m. and when we arrived they were all waiting outside to greet us and let us know we had found the right place. As I got out of the car his mother, Catherine, gave me the biggest hug even before we got introduced. We then met his brother Mark, sister-in-law Gail, and his sister Jean. I opened the box and gave it to Catherine. She held it and touched the Purple Heart as only a mother can do knowing she was thinking of her son, Curt. We had a great time talking with the family over dinner that day. This was a most moving and exciting day I can ever remember. We now have made new friends forever and the search was over.

I have learned the importance of never giving up on something you know will bring much emotion and joy to others. When you experience something like I have just gone through you know life is full of wonderful things and that this was a day to remember always.

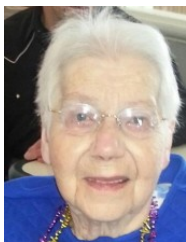

Wills for Veterans Clinic

Man of Honor is willing to open the clubhouse for the Wills for Veterans Clinic again on October 17th. If you don't have a will, now is the time to get one FREE OF CHARGE.

Wills for Veterans is a program sponsored by Ruder Ware, L.L.S.C. It is designed to assist eligible veterans and their spouses or domestic partner in preparing basic estate planning documents. A veteran is eligible to participate if he or she has an individual net worth of \$650,000 or less. A veteran and his or her spouse or domestic partner are eligible to participate if they have combined net worth of \$1,300,000 or less.

Appointment times range from 9:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. Each veteran should plan on arriving at his or her assigned appointment time and stay for approximately two hours, starting with a movie, during the preparation of his or her basic estate planning documents.
